REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS
FOR COORDINATION OF A
STATEWIDE
COLLABORATIVE
JOURNALISM PROJECT IN
MONTANA

The Montana Newspaper
Foundation seeks proposals
from an experienced editor or
news organization to
coordinate an enterprising,
statewide collaborative
journalism project among
Montana's newspapers.
The Foundation and the
project coordinator will identify
key participants in the project,
sound them out for potential
enterprising topics, and
create an inspiring dialogue to
bring newsrooms together to
determine the ultimate focus
and the specific components
of the project. With substantial
input from collaborators, the
Project Coordinator will ensure
the project parameters and
ultimate goals of the work are
clearly defined and formally
documented. The Project
Coordinator will then
oversee the collaborators' work,
coordinating the collaborative
efforts leading up to wide
publication of the content
created. The coordinator will
produce regular progress reports
for the Foundation and a final
report summarizing the work
completed and detailing the
outcomes.

BACKGROUND
In October of 2017, the
Solutions Journalism Network
launched the Montana Gap
Project, a collaborative effort
among 12 Montana
newsrooms that produced
two feature packages of news
content. The first package,
published in January of 2018,
consisted of 27 stories focused
on rural economic
development. The second
package, published in July
of 2018, included 16 stories
highlighting mental health
treatment. A follow-up survey
of participating newsroom
audiences showed that people
who had read "Montana Gap"
stories were "significantly more
likely to say the trusted their
local paper's coverage—and
that the paper helped people
get involved in community
issues."

In January of 2019, the SJN
approached the Montana
Newspaper Association to
form a partnership to expand
the Montana Gap Project
with the support of the LOR
Foundation and a grant from
Keneda Fund. The vision for
the expanded project calls
for broader participation from
Montana's newsrooms and
the development of durable
relationships and expertise
that could provide the basis
for ongoing, collaborative,

solutions-oriented journalism
projects in a similar vein.
In June of 2019, the Montana
Newspaper Foundation, the
501(c)(3) arm of the
newspaper association,
entered into an agreement with
the Solutions Journalism
Network to oversee expansion
of the Montana Gap Project
with the hope of building the
capacity for ongoing,
collaborative,
solutions-oriented reporting
across the state.
The Foundation seeks a
Project Coordinator to
effectively lead the initiative
and invites proposals from
experienced editors and new
organizations to oversee the
effort.

ANTICIPATED WORK
Project Scoping
The Foundation and the
Project Coordinator will
convene a working group of
newsroom collaborators to
determine the project focus
and parameters. The
Foundation and the Project
Coordinator will identify key
participants in the project,
sound them out for potential
enterprising topics, and
create an inspiring dialogue to
bring newsrooms together to
ultimately determine the focus
and the specific components
of the project. The Project
Coordinator will ensure the
project parameters and
ultimate goals of the project
are clearly defined and
formally documented.
Oversight of Content Creation
and Publication
The substantive goal of the
project is to publish significant,
influential, enterprising
journalism across the state
of Montana, and the Project
Coordinator will oversee the
reporting done by the
collaborators, ensuring they
stay on schedule, produce
high quality work, and maintain
a cooperative spirit. The
Project Coordinator will ensure
successful publication of the
content created to maximize
potential benefit to Montana
newspapers and Montana
citizens.

Recommending Potential
Subgrants
As the project develops, the
Foundation anticipates that
key collaborators will pursue
additional grants to defray
direct project expenses. The
Project Coordinator will invite
collaborators to submit grant
requests, evaluate the grant
requests, and make grant
recommendations to SJN. The
SJN shall make final decisions
on grants, and it will administer
those awards independently.
Reporting Progress and
Outcomes
The Project Coordinator will
provide regular progress
updates. The Project
Coordinator will submit a
formal report at the project's
mid-point and provide a final
report on the project's
successes and failures.

Proposals will be evaluated
according to a combination of
technical merit and a
well-articulated understanding
of the Foundation's
aspirations.
Proposals should include the
following components:

- A summary of relevant
experience, with a suggested
emphasis on collaborative
enterprise reporting
- Examples of previous work
- An articulate vision for
solutions-oriented journalism
- A strategy for convening
potential newsroom
collaborators
- A strategy to promote the
project's published content

Successful proposals should
specify that the applicant
meets the following criteria:

- 5 years + of producing,
editing and publishing
enterprising news content;
- Demonstrated ability to work
collaboratively;
- Demonstrated capacity to
fulfill role of project coordinator
- Access to and knowledge of
all necessary software and
equipment, including shared
communication, word
processing and spreadsheet
applications.

BUDGET
The Foundation has budgeted
\$27,000 for coordination of the
project. Subgrants to
collaborators would potentially
provide additional financial
resources over and above the
project coordination budget.
ETHICS
The project coordinator will
pledge to conduct the work
in a professional and ethical
manner at all times, including
a commitment to truthfulness
and accuracy.
